With the official fire season now over it is once again time to start thinking about the continued threat. With such a heavy fuel build up over the summer period consider a hazard reduction program this winter on your place.

Smoke Alarms – Important reminder – change your smoke alarm batteries before we head into the winter months. The best and safest type of smoke alarm is a Photoelectric alarm, as it can detect smoke in the smouldering stage and in areas remote from the detector.
